



Medical Records

- Diagnosis of the brain injury
- Treatment history
- Surgical reports (if applicable)
- Imaging scans (CT scans, MRI scans, X-rays)
- Emergency room records
- Emergency room records
- Prescription or pharmacy records



Physician Reports

- Neurologist's report
- Neuropsychologist's report
- Psychiatrist's report (if relevant)
- Primary care physician's notes



Therapy Records

- Occupational therapy reports
- Speech therapy reports
- Physical therapy reports



Work Records

- Documentation of lost wages or reduced earning capacity
- Employer statements regarding changes in performance or work duties post-injury



Witness Statements

- Statements from individuals who witnessed the accident or observed changes in behavior post-injury



Accident Reports

- Police reports (if applicable)
- Incident reports from the scene of the accident
- Workplace accident reports (if applicable)



Photographs/Videos

- Images of the accident scene
- Photos of visible injuries
- Videos documenting the accident or immediate aftermath (if available)



Insurance Documents

- Health insurance policies
- Auto insurance policies (if the injury resulted from a car accident)
- Workers' compensation documents (if applicable)



Financial Records

- Medical bills and expenses related to the injury
- Receipts for medical equipment or home modifications necessitated by the injury



Journal Entries

- Personal diary entries documenting symptoms, progress, or setbacks
- Notes about changes in cognitive function or behavior



Incident Documentation

- Letters or emails exchanged with involved parties (e.g., insurance adjusters, employers)
- Notes from meetings or conversations related to the injury or claim



Preservation of Physical Evidence

- Retention of damaged personal items (e.g., helmet, clothing) as evidence
- Maintenance of any physical evidence from the accident scene
